We had no idea our way of business was about to change!


Before the pandemic

- ROADTRIP
 Virtual conference
- Majority of our alumni live in Indiana, set a goal to visit more alumni the state.
- We had roughly 2K unmanaged top prospects in Indiana.
- Idea we had was to have small gatherings of alumni to meet with development staff and Dean, Department Head, or similar administrative representative.
- We hosted three days in 2019 where we took the Dean or Associate Dean on the road.

speaker telling the groups how the Ag Alumni Association celebrated the 2020 Purdue Ag graduates.




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Lessons learned

- The older the alum, the more likely to register and the longer the introductions
- Created organic conversations with many alumni in a time when it was hard to communicate with alumni
- The 2000s reunion had the least amount of people, but great group conversations.



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What came next

- April hosted multiple reunions in HLA, ANSC, and ENTM
- Kelly started seminar series in AGRY, BTNY, and FNR
- Cameron and Joel hosted reunions in AGEC, FDSC, ASEC













Plan going forward



- Post pandemic, travel will resume what practices will continue from the last year?
- Likely continue a mix of in-person and virtual alumni/donor events. (online target older alums, dept specific events)
- Trip/trip planning. If visiting a city and unable to connect in person, ask for a virtual visit once we get back to campus the following week
- What have we learned from adapting to fundraising virtually?
 - Virtual interactions are great for qualifying prospects
 - In person events are not always the best use of time and resources
 - Think outside of the box, don't become stagnant in your processes, look for innovative ideas that could generate new prospects
